We very much hope that you will take this opportunity to attend and to develop a range of officials from your country and promote wakeboarding.

As with most board sports, wakeboarding uses a subjective scoring system. It is therefore essential that all judges and officials are trained to apply the rules and judging criteria consistently and are equipped with the right tools for the job.

The International Judging program has been in place in IWWF – region Europe and Africa since 1999 and judges and officials are required to attend the relevant course, to sit examinations and are rewarded by certification.

The seminar is held in a relaxed informal atmosphere, with plenty of time for discussion to help learning together and the sharing of experience as well as meeting new friends and old ones within the wakeboarding community.

Judging Examinations - there are 4 levels of examination:

- Assistant Judge National Level 2
- Judge National Level 1
- National Chief Judge International Level 2
- International Chief Judge International Level 1

Each of the levels allows the judges to progress each year, gaining experience along the way. Typical events that International Level 1 judges are qualified to judge are:

- IWWF European Championships
- IWWF European Pro Tour
- IWWF Wakeboard World Championships
- World Games

The Wakeboard Judges' Course:

- Introduction
- Safety
- Rules
- Protest
- Timinas
- Qualification & judging levels
- The wakeboard course
- Competition Scoring
- Calculating and heat systems (see calculator examinations below).
- Obstacles
- Tricks, rotations, inverts and grabs



- Video Analysis
- Questions and answers

Video footage used is broadcast quality material, normal speed is followed by slow motion to enable discussion. Discussion and debate at the seminar is particularly useful to increase learning opportunities, to continually update knowledge and improve consistency among judges.

It is important that judges continue to attend seminars after certification to ensure that your experience is shared and to keep up to date with new developments in judging and scoring.

Calculation Examinations – there are 3 levels of examination:

- National Calculator
- International Calculator Level 2
- International Calculator Level 1

The Calculators' Course:

- Rules
- The heat system
- Seeding
- The role of the calculator before, during and after the competition
- Planning and Scheduling the competition
- Competition scoring and calculation
- Scoring software

Part of the calculation session will be held with all officials present, as it is important that judges also know and understand the seeding and scoring system.

Calculation session with the calculation software

An essential part of the seminar for calculators will be the introduction of the official European Wakeboard Calculation program.

All participants should bring a laptop to the seminar but please note the software only runs on Windows systems (not Apple).

It is important for all existing calculators to attend to become familiar with the program and to learn how to use it with ease.

Arriving in Brussels

Airport: The Hotel provides a free shuttle bus service from and to the airport. Please don't forget to fill in your arrival/departure information in reservation form. Also, when you arrive call the Hotel on +32 2 708 31 00. Alternatively – you can choose to take a taxi!

Brussels Midi: go to the metro station that has access in the train station (follow "Metro" signs) and take tram 2 or 6 direction: Elisabeth until "Madou" station. This will take approximately 10 minutes / 7 stops. From Madou station follow "Bus" signs and take bus #318 or #351 or #410 direction Brussel/ Moorsel/ Leuven (NL) or Bruxelles/Moorsel/Louvain (FR) until "Evere De Paduwa" station.

This will take approximately 16 – 20 minutes / 10 stops. Walk 1 minute from Evere De Paduwa to the Hotel.

N.B.: Please, keep in mind, that public transport is limited during evenings and nights. Alternatively – you can choose to take a taxi!
